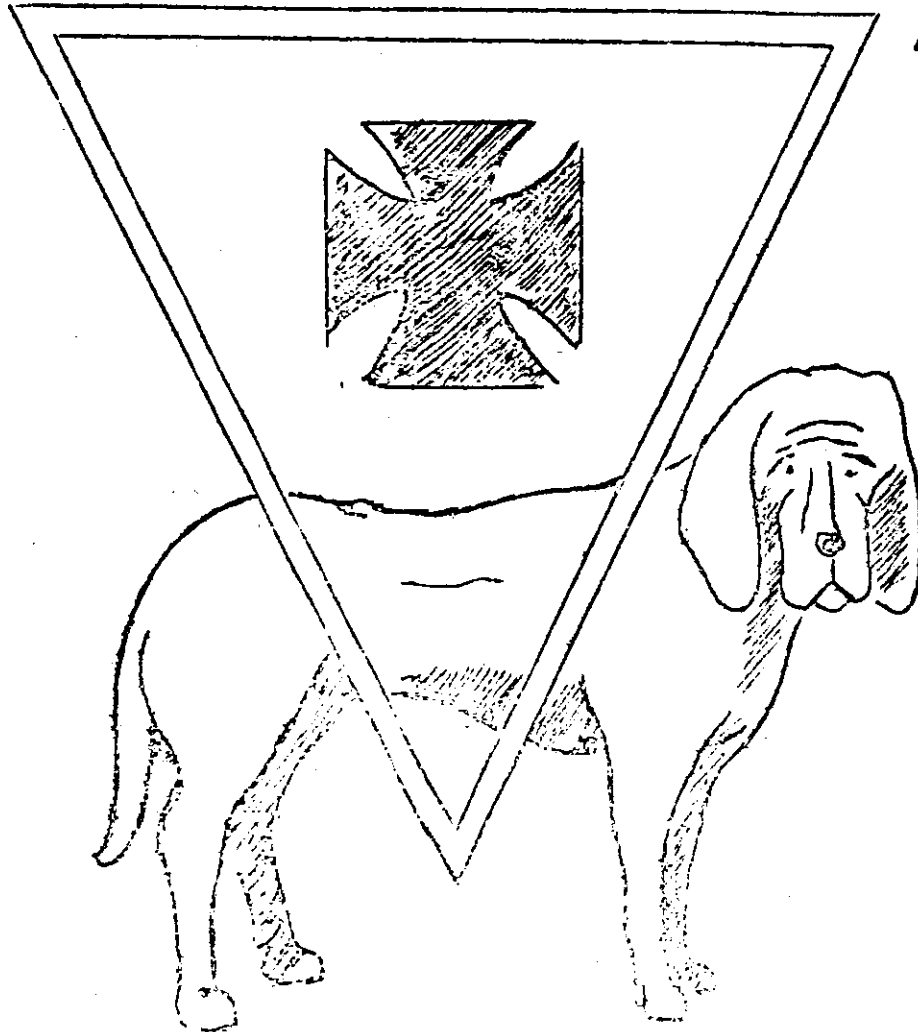

1. NAME AND TYPE OF OPERATION: Operation BLOODEHOUND / **BUSHMASTER II** - Search and Destroy.

2. DATES OF OPERATION: 261000H November 1965 - 091500H December 1965.

3. LOCATION: BINH DUONG Province and LONG NGUYEN area south of MICHELIN RUBBER PLANTATION (Overlay attached).

7. SUPPORTING FORCES:

a. 2/33 Artillery:

(1) Size of Force: 1 six gun and 1 five gun 105MM Howitzer Battery and Headquarters Battery position DALLAS; D 8/6 Arty 8 inch and B 2/32 Arty 175MM GS from LAI KHE.

(2) How and When Employed:

(a) Btry A (6 gun) was airlifted to DAU TIENG Airfield to support 2/2 Infantry in reinforcing 5th ARVN Division.

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(b) Btry B (5 gun) was airlifted to DAU TIENG Airfield 30 November 1965.

(c) Btry C fired in support of LAI KHE perimeter.

(d) 2 December 1965 Battalion moved by motor column to position DALLAS and supported maneuver battalions to 5 December 1965. 5 Dec 1965 Battalion withdrew to DAU TIENG for airlift to LAI KHE. Batteries D 8/6 Arty (8") and B 2/32 Arty (175MM) assumed the support mission, from LAI KHE.

(e) During the period from 1 - 9 Dec 65 the Battalion fired 3113 105MM rounds, 602 8 inch Howitzer rounds and 435 175MM gun rounds.

(3) Results of Effectiveness: The Battalion's fire support was outstanding. Fire was effectively placed on known and suspected VC locations. Fire support was continuous throughout the operation by shifting responsibility to longer range direct support artillery when out of 105MM range.

b. US Air Force: During the period from 1-9 Dec 65, one hundred four (104) close air support sorties were flown in support of the 3d Bde. The air support rendered on 5 Dec and 6 Dec 65 enabled 2/2 Infantry to successfully defeat a numerically superior force. 3d Bde also received 80 C-123 sorties to move Pde forward CP and the 2/33 Arty (-) to and from DAU TIENG airstrip. 8. INTELLIGENCE: The Viet Cong strength on 28 November was considered to be one (1) battalion (name unknown) located vic XT460450, 1 regiment (Q272) located vic XT650470, the PHU LOI battalion located vic XT730450, one company vic XT710370 (name unknown) and one company located vic XT830440 with a total strength of approximately 2400 VC.

At the time of the Brigade units' arrival at the MICHELIN PLANTATION the Brigade expected to encounter elements of the Q273 regiment and a battalion from Q271 regiment (formerly the Q763) and the 761 regiment. As the Brigade mission was extended and reports received from the civilian populace and military agents it was anticipated that during periods 2 Dec to 9 Dec 65 we would encounter the PHU LOI battalion. On 4 Dec 65 a VC POW was picked up at XT773454. He indicated at this time that he was in a Medical Platoon as a member of the PHU LOI battalion. He further stated that the battalion was in that vicinity and moving west.

After the encounter on 5 Dec 65, documents taken from VC dead and the VC captured on 7 Dec 65 vicinity XT692467 indicated that we had encountered the Q272 regiment with an estimated strength of 1200. Other intelligence documents captured during this period were enemy signal SOI's, code words, and pass words.

The area of operation was jungle with heavy undergrowth, very limited observation; no main avenues of approach were encountered. The terrain was slightly rolling offering limited cover when in a prone position.

9. MISSION: From 1st Infantry Division FRAG ORDER 14-65:

a. One Battalion 2d Brigade attached on arrival DAU TIENG or LZ's to be designated.

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- b. Conduct operations in TAOR's PEAR and ORANGE.
 - c. Prepare to conduct operations in TAOR's APPLE and PEACH as the enemy situation develops.
 - d. Enter TAOR PEAR at 010700H Dec 65 to attack and destroy VC concentrations and supply bases.
 - e. Be prepared to assist 5th ARVN Division as required in conduct of their operation.
 - f. Assist in the defense of the DAU TIENG airfield in conjunction with 5th ARVN Division.
 - g. 105MM Howitzer, 8 inch Howitzer and 175MM gun artillery available from LAI KHE.
 - h. Movement east of artillery fire coordination line only on order this headquarters.
 - i. Delta reconnaissance teams will be operating in TAOR ORANGE. Effect liaison with SA 5th ARVN Division prior to firing into that area.
10. CONCEPT OF OPERATIONS: From 3d Brigade FRAG ORDER 13-65, Operation BLOODHOUND, dated 301500H November 1965.

EXECUTION:

- a. Concept of Operations, 3d Brigade operations will be conducted in phases:
 - (1) PHASE I. 01 Dec 65 movement from present locations at DAU TIENG (XT4947) to DENVER (XT5952), DALLAS (XT5850) and DETROIT (XT5848). 2/2 Inf clears FIRESTONE AVE to DALLAS for the movement of 2/33 Arty Bn (-) and 2/16 Inf. Upon passage of 2/2 Inf, 1/16 Inf will conduct operations in the MICHELIN RUBBER PLANTATION in zone to DETROIT. On order, 2/16 Inf (-) escorts 2/33 Arty (-) and Brigade CP to DALLAS over FIRESTONE AVENUE.
 - (2) PHASE II. 02 December 1965, 2/2 Inf (reinforced) and 1/16 Inf move in that order to positions on LINE PACIFIC. On order conduct search and destroy operations from LINE PACIFIC toward LINE CALIFORNIA.
 - (3) Subsequent PHASES will be announced as the situation develops.
- b. 2/2 Inf (attached one rifle company, 2/16 Inf).
 - (1) Move 010700H Dec 65 to clear FIRESTONE AVE from DAU TIENG to DALLAS.
 - (2) Upon arrival at DALLAS select route and move to DENVER.
 - (3) Prepare for continuing to LINE PACIFIC and conduct of search and destroy operations in PHASE II.
- c. 1/16 Infantry.
 - (1) Move on 01 Dec 65, after passage of 2/2 Inf, from present position conducting search and destroy operations in zone to DETROIT.
 - (2) After 1/16 Inf has cleared to the south of FIRESTONE AVE, secure move of 2/33 Arty Bn (-) and Brigade TAC CP on FIRESTONE AVE from present location to DALLAS.
 - (3) In PHASE II conduct local search and destroy operations vicinity of DALLAS.

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(4) Be prepared as rapid reaction force to assist 5th ARVN Division elements operating in MICHELIN RUBBER PLANTATION.

(5) Be prepared for commitment in Zone of 2/2 Inf or 1/16 Inf.

(6) Be prepared to secure movement of 2/33 Arty (-) to DAU TIENG on order.

e. 2/28 Inf. Be prepared for commitment between LINES COLORADO and MISSOURI.

f. A Troop 1/4 Cav. Be prepared for commitment between LINES COLORADO and MISSOURI.

g. 2/33 Arty Bn (DS).

(1) Support 3d Bde operations with one battery (reinforced) at LAI KHE and with Bn (-) from DALLAS.

(2) Move from present locations on FIRESTONE AVENUE to DALLAS secured by 2/16 Inf and in coordination with CO, 2/16 Infantry.

(3) Prepare for displacement to DAU TIENG on order to be extracted to LAI KHE.

h. Brigade Trains. Remain in present positions.

i. Coordinating Instructions.

(1) Report closing at DENVER, DALLAS, and DETROIT.

(2) Report arrival at PHASE LINES.

(3) Plan to begin securing for the night at 1530 hours daily.

(4) Report completion of logistics extractions each morning.

(5) Be prepared to assist 5th ARVN Division as required in the conduct of their operations.

REMARKS: On 27 Nov 65 the 7th ARVN Regt became decisively engaged with a large VC force in MICHELIN RUBBER PLANTATION and suffered heavy casualties. Commanding General, 1st Infantry Division directed that a 3d Bde Task Force be airlifted to assist the 7th ARVN Regt. The operation consisted of airlifting 1/16 Infantry, Co C 2/2 Infantry, Btry A 2/33 Arty and Bde TAC CP by helicopter and C-123 aircraft to DAU TIENG AIRSTRIP on 28 Nov 1965. 1/16 Infantry Bn moved immediately into position to protect the 7th ARVN Regt while they policed the battle area for bodies, wounded, weapons and equipment.

On 29 Nov 65, Commanding General 1st Inf Div ordered the move of the remainder of the 2/2 Infantry Bn and B Btry 2/33 Arty into the battle area.

On 30 Nov 65, 1st Infantry Division FRAG ORDER 14-65 ordering 3d Bde to conduct search and destroy operations southeast of MICHELIN RUBBER PLANTATION was issued. This order attached 2/16 Infantry Bn, 1st Brigade, 1st Infantry Division to 3d Brigade; and the unit was airlifted into DAU TIENG airstrip on 30 Nov 65.

On 010700H Dec 65, Operation BLOODHOUND was initiated with movement of 2/2 Infantry Bn to position DALLAS. 1/16 Infantry Bn finished its security mission of 7th ARVN Regt and coiled near position DALLAS, 2/16 Infantry Bn was the security force for Bde TAC CP and 2/33 Arty Bn (-) at DAU TIENG airstrip.

On 02 Dec 65, 2/16 Infantry, 2/33 Arty Bn (-) and Bde TAC CP moved to position DALLAS. 2/2 Infantry and 1/16 Infantry conducted search and destroy operations in their respective zones to PHASE LINE PACIFIC.

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On 03 Dec 65 2/16 Infantry Bn secured 2/33 Arty Bn (-) and Bde TAC CP at position DALLAS. 2/2 Infantry and 1/16 Infantry conducted search and destroy operations in zone from PHASE LINE PACIFIC to PHASE LINE CALIFORNIA. On 03 Dec 65 at XT655524 the 2/2 Infantry located and destroyed a large way station consisting of several buildings. Later that day at XT663513 the battalion found and destroyed a grenade and mine factory consisting of 12 buildings, assorted tools, and over 1000 grenades and grenade molds. 2/502 Airborne Bn Task Force joined 3d Bde Task Force by moving from vic BEN HOA on Route BLUE to the 1/16 Inf base camp perimeter near BEN CAT (XT755330) but remained under Division control.

04 Dec 1965 Bde TAC CP and 2/33 Arty Bn (-) secured by 2/16 Inf Bn continued occupancy of position DALLAS. 2/2 Inf and 1/16 Infantry continued search and destroy operations from PHASE LINE CALIFORNIA to PHASE LINE ARIZONA. At 042130H Dec 65 near XT686486 2/2 Inf detonated two claymore mines against a VC patrol consisting of approximately 30 men. Five VC were killed, (body count); another five were estimated killed and an estimated ten VC were wounded. 1/16 Inf captured 1 VC female and 4 children vic XT629459-- also 500 lbs of rice. POW's and rice were evacuated by helicopters to LAI KHE base camp. Three houses and twelve new shovels were destroyed in the same location. The battalion captured 14 VCS (old men, women, and children) vic XT634447 and these were later extracted by resupply helicopters to LAI KHE base camp. The battalion discovered a base camp complex consisting of a repair shop, mess hall, weapons maintenance shop, a large quantity of ammunition, fortified positions, tunnels, documents, and medical supplies vic XT634474. The unit also destroyed 7 fortified houses and a tunnel complex vic XT644475 and destroyed a base camp vic XT644468. Five houses were burned vic XT648454 and 11 VCS women and children were apprehended and were airlifted with resupply helicopters to LAI KHE.

05 Dec 65 Bde TAC CP and 2/33 Arty Bn (-) with route security provided by 2/16 Infantry returned over route FIRESTONE 40B to DAU TIENG airstrip. 2/2 Infantry and 1/16 Infantry continued search and destroy operations from PHASE LINE ARIZONA toward PHASE LINE COLORADO. The 1/16 Infantry discovered a VC training center vic XT645452. Mighty Mike with CS and demolitions were used to destroy the tunnels. The battalion located a hospital, messhall, and supplies vic XT645425 and was turned on by 3 VC. Co B 1/16 Infantry returned the fire wounding two (2) VC and killing one (1) VC estimated, while capturing two (2) 81 cal mortars and one (1) submachine gun. A large amount of blood was found in the area occupied by these VC but the individuals were not there. Co B discovered an ammunition repacking station, messhall, hospital supplies and two (2) houses vic XT642415 and destroyed this complex.

At 051230H Dec 65, 2/2 Infantry made contact with an estimated VC regiment from XT693467 to XT697463 (AP NHA CAT area). The enemy employed mortars, 50 caliber machine guns, and recoilless rifles in defense of his well-entrenched positions guarding a well-developed base camp area. Air support and artillery were used to suppress the VC fires at the point of contact, and later to interdict VC efforts to reorganize their forces. The assaulting infantry elements developed those VC who sought refuge from air and artillery attack by attempting to close with the ground troops. The battalion overran the VC force and moved through the jungle area with its wounded to XT697457 for medical evacuation of the wounded personnel. A reinforced company was airlifted into the battle area from 2/24 Infantry linked up with the battalion at XT697457 at 052445H Dec 65. Before extraction of 08 Dec 65, the battalion made repeated detailed searches and sweeps of the battlefield to dominate it, denying the base camp to the enemy, and recovering the battalion dead, and both friendly and enemy equipment. During the operation the battalion lost 42 men killed and 102 men wounded. Enemy losses were 301 VC killed (body count), 100 estimated killed, and 204 estimated wounded, including one VC captured.

06 Dec 1965 Bde TAC CP and 2/33 Arty Bn (-) were airlifted from DAU TIENG airstrip to LAI KHE airstrip by C-123 aircraft by utilizing HC sorties.

2/2 Infantry continued the battlefield search vic grid square XT6946 to remove and evacuate friendly KIA and captured material.

1/16 Infantry continued search and destroy operations in zone.

2/16 Infantry continued medical airlift from vic DAU TIENG with the 1st Liftorf at 060431H Dec 65. This lift landed vic LZ XT685435 at

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061100H Dec 65. The last lift (Number 3) arrived at the LZ at 1158 hours 6 December 1965. All lifts were completed without incident. A+ 061340H Dec 65 Company B and Company C 2/16 Infantry found 3 VC base camps vic XT692447 to XT686446 approximately 500-600 meters apart. At 061420H Dec 65 Company B 2/2 Inf discovered a recently occupied base camp containing 100 lbs of rice and 11 Chicom handgrenades vic XT698449. At 061640H Dec 65 the Bn discovered and destroyed 30 tons of rice vic XT690457.

At 060130H Dec 65, Company A 1/16 Inf was attacked by a VC force of from 15 to 20 men from vic XT648415 which threw approximately 60 handgrenades supplemented by carbine fire and mixed small arms fire. Co A returned the fire and the VC force withdrew leaving blood trails behind. One (1) man from Co A was slightly wounded. Approximately 20 VC grenades failed to explode. At 060910H Dec 65 Commander 1/16 Inf spotted from his OH-13 helicopter 6 to 8 VC in uniform pushing 2 carts, and emplacements along the road from XT6241 to XT6341. An airstrike was requested and accomplished. At 061400 hours Co A destroyed 15 to 18 huts, a mess area with 300 to 400 capacity, kitchen facilities, 400 lbs of rice, a bunker complex, animals and one Chicom claymore type mine at XT659416.

07 Dec 65, 2/2 Inf, 1/16 Inf and 2/16 Inf conducted search and destroy operations from Phase Line COLORADO back toward Phase Line ARIZONA.

At 070925H Dec 65, at XT695468, CO 2/2 Infantry spotted approximately 300 VC from his OH-13 helicopter. An airstrike was requested and accomplished. The results of this airstrike are unknown.

08 Dec 65, 2/2 Infantry was extracted from XT697457 by twenty (20) HUUD helicopters, which was satisfactorily and smoothly completed in 50 minutes. 3d Bde received orders from 1st Infantry Division to place 2/16 Infantry on the west to facilitate future operations. Company C 2/28 Infantry was detached from 2/2 Infantry and attached to 1/16 Infantry. The maneuver units, 1/16 Inf and 2/16 Inf conducted search and destroy operations toward Phase Line KANSAS.

09 Dec 65, 1st Bn 16th Inf conducted search and destroy operations in zone from vic Phase Line MISSOURI to Phase Line MISSOURI. The Bn closed into LAI KHE base camp at 0915H Dec 65 with negative contact during search and destroy operations.

09 Dec 65, 2/2 Inf conducted search and destroy operations in zone from vic Phase Line KANSAS to XT697457 and was placed under the operational control of the 1st Infantry Division effective 091500H Dec 65 by order of Commander General 1st Infantry Division.

Operation BANG was completed at 041500H December 1965.

17. OPERATIONAL ASSESSMENT

a. Preparation Phase:

(1) Ammunition for previous operations for attached battalions had to be replaced. Ammunition requests were approved and delivery completed 2 days after attachment.

(2) Air Logistical Center was opened at LAI KHE.

(3) Requests for sundry packs were dispatched.

b. Execution Phase: Resupply was flown from LAI KHE to the battalions. No particular problems after the 1st morning when the helicopters were 2 hours late for extracting water cans, mortars, and entrenching tools. The Brigade has only the capability of handling rations and ammunition to attached battalions who are flown in light w/o trains or air trains to LAI KHE. Division turned down requests for helicopters to fly out captured rice.

c. Extraction Phase: No particular problems.

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d. Lessons Learned:

(1) Planning must include provisions of aerial or land trains for battalions being attached for more than 4 days. Resupply of socks, mosquito repellent, sundries, clothing is not feasible.

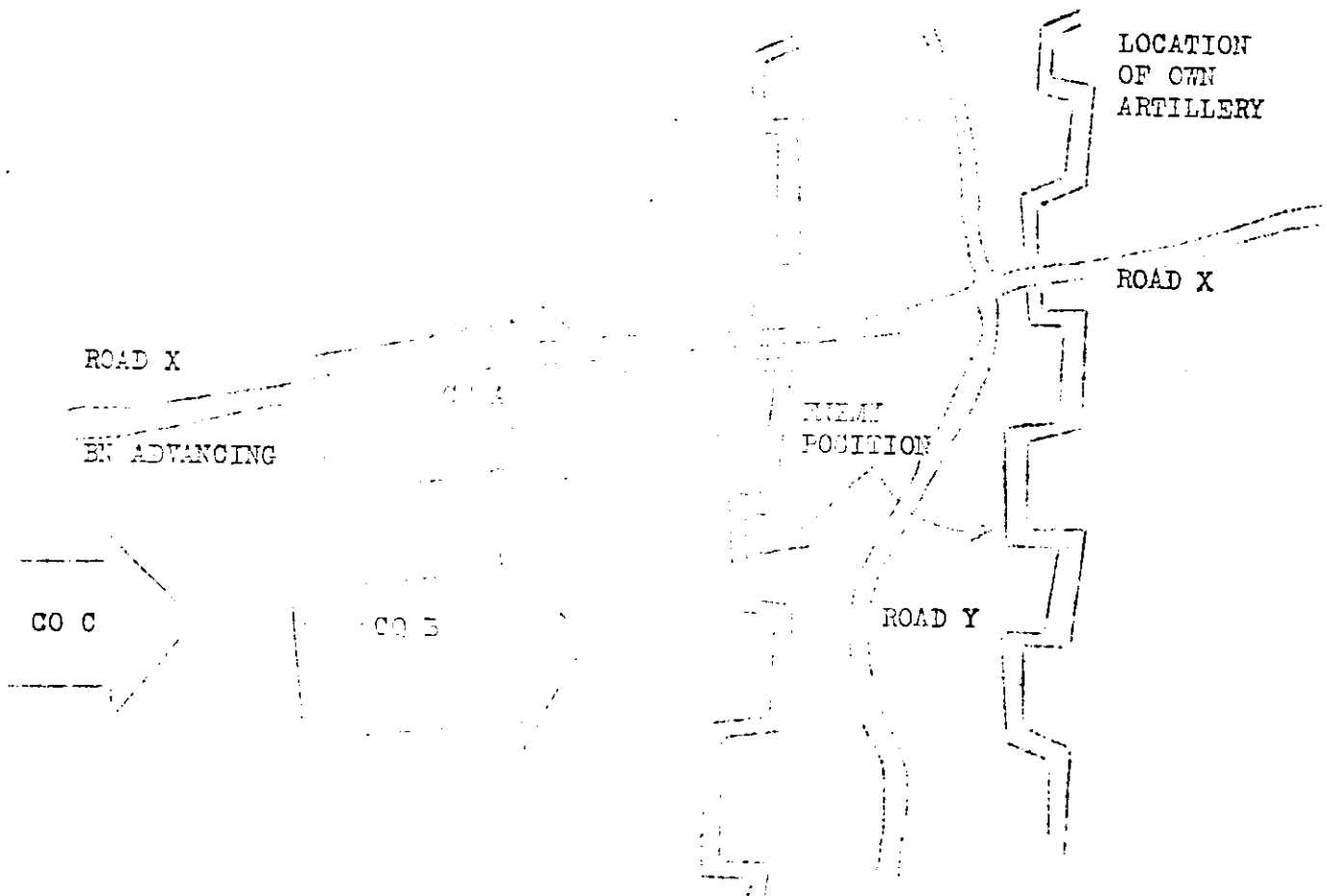
(2) Acquisitions of helicopters for extraction of captured material probably will decrease due to over use of helicopters.

15. COMMANDERS ANALYSIS:

The Brigade has concluded yet another major operation. The move back to MICHELIN PLANTATION, the operations therein, and the campaign on the way back were accomplished with increasing military proficiency. A major battle was fought at AP NHA MAT with Brigade Forces emerging victorious and dominating the battlefield. Destruction of many enemy installations including base camps, mess halls, mine and grenade factories, rice caches and hospitals will further help the cause for freedom for Vietnam.

To achieve the most rapid support from the fighter bombers and helicopter gunships, commanders must be aware of terrain features visible from the air and attempt to use these features, rather than smoke, as target delineators. Also, the gun-target line to the artillery should always be known. Due consideration to these factors before entering into a combat situation will naturally reduce coordination time at the start of a battle. The following sketch illustrates these considerations:



In a jungle search and clear operation such as the one depicted above the battalion could maneuver to the right with Company C and have all members of Company A get to the right of the Road X. This will permit the fighter bombers to strike to the left of Road X when they

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arrive on the scene. Artillery can start to fire immediately on the other side of Road Y and have the fire adjusted by the ground Forward Observer. The helicopter gunships can support the maneuver force by direction of the ground commander.

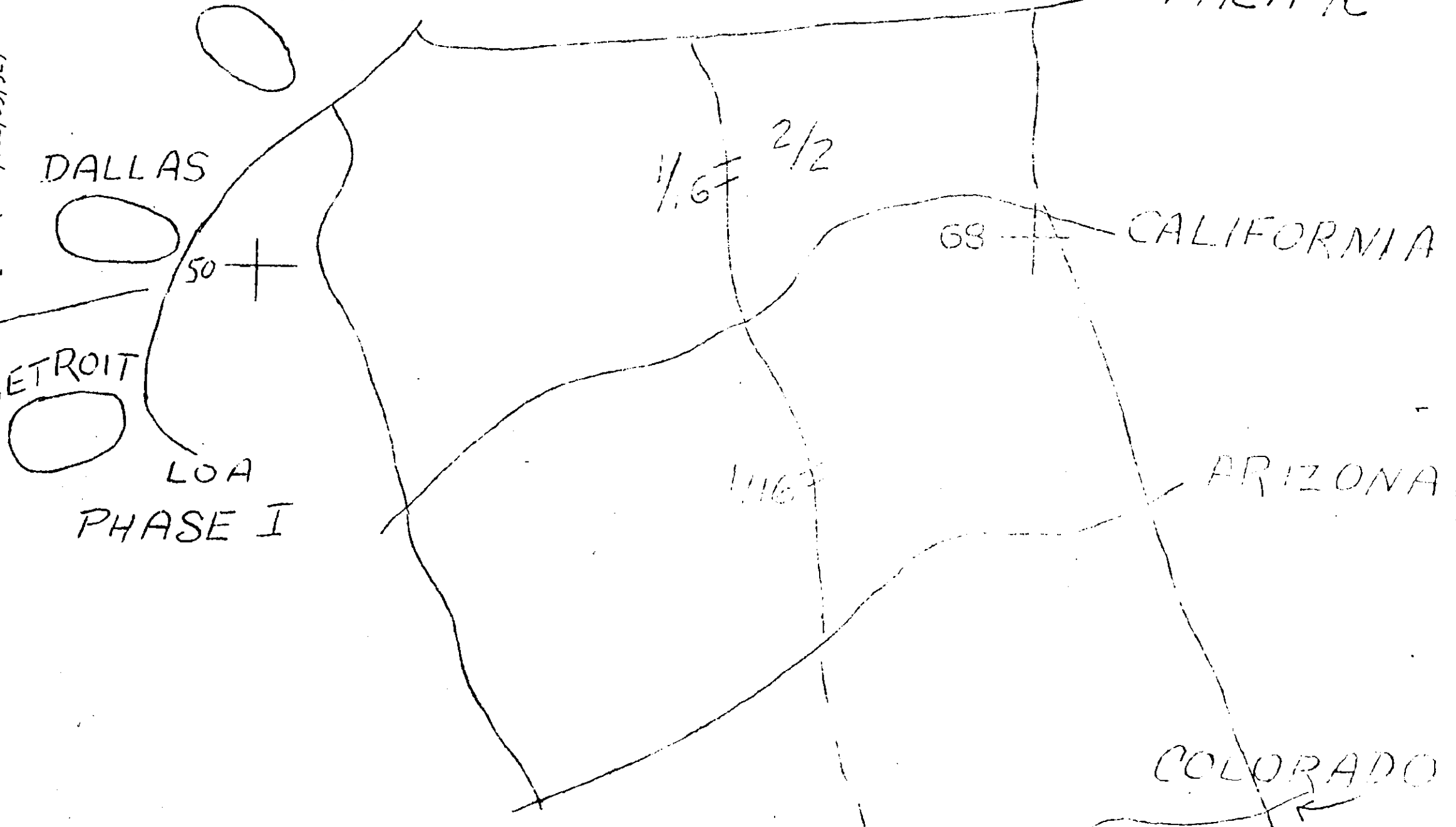
